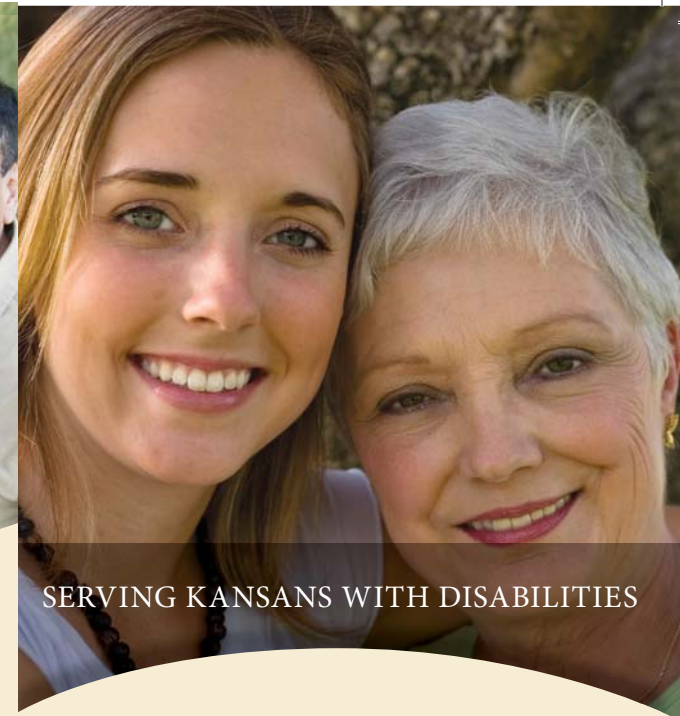
Employment Services

RCIL provides support services to help people achieve their employment goals. Services may include setting work goals, enhancing work skills, developing a resume and interview preparation. We offer benefits counseling to help people understand how employment may affect an individual's benefits.

Community Education

Community education and outreach is available to increase public awareness of living with a disability. RCIL is committed to collaborative partnerships and networking within the community to expand the participation of persons with significant disabilities in services, programs, activities, resources and facilities.

Technical assistance is also available to better understand state and federal laws that assist in the availability of services and employment for persons with disabilities. For example, RCIL provides technical assistance to businesses when hiring and retaining employees with disabilities. Assistance with understanding The Rehabilitation Act and Americans with Disabilities Act is also available to the public.

Core Services

Advocacy

• Individual Advocacy

RCIL helps people with disabilities develop the skills they need to represent themselves. These skills help them act on their own behalf to obtain support services from agencies in the community.

• Systems Advocacy

We work at community, state and federal levels for policy changes that make facilities, services and opportunities accessible to people with disabilities.

Peer Counseling

RCIL helps connect a person with a disability with other people who have a disability and are living independently in the community. Together, they explore options and solve problems that sometimes occur for people with disabilities. For example, they may help each other adjust to a newly acquired disability, adapt to changes in living arrangements, or learn to use community services more effectively.

Deinstitutionalization

Individuals who live in a facility, or are at risk of entering one, have community options. We help them learn their choices and find the resources they need for the option they choose.

Independent Living Skills Training

RCIL offers training to help people with disabilities learn skills to live as independently as they choose. Individualized support includes personal care training, help to obtain and use assistive technology, housing search assistance, how to access transportation or healthcare systems, budgeting and other topics as needed.

Information and Referral

RCIL's resource library provides valuable information on disability topics. We also make appropriate referrals to other community agencies to help individuals obtain these services.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS)

RCIL is a provider for the following Kansas HCBS Waivers:

- Physical Disability (PD) – Independent Living Counseling, Self-Directed Payroll Agent
- Frail & Elderly (FE) – Self-Directed Payroll Agent
- Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) – Targeted Case Management, Transitional Living Skills and Self-Directed Payroll Agent
- Mental Retardation Developmental Disability (MRDD) – Affiliate Payroll Agent

Payroll & Billing

RCIL is a payroll agent for HCBS self-directed attendant care services. Most often, individuals are recipients of PD, FE, or TBI HCBS waiver services. We are a payroll agent for HCBS MRDD and Senior Care Act affiliated agencies. We also contract with consumers and/or families for private-pay payroll services.

Independent Living Counseling/Targeted Case Management

RCIL provides independent living counseling for people on the HCBS PD Waiver. We also provide targeted case management for individuals receiving HCBS TBI Waiver Services.

Independent living counselors and targeted case managers work with individuals to develop an annual plan of care to meet their needs. This plan ensures access to a variety of services and service providers. Counselors and case managers work with other providers to gain the best available services while promoting the independent living philosophy.
